

GATHERED IN BY JAY GOULD.

AND HIS TELEGRAPHS SOLD OUT. RIGHT TO WASHINGTON.

Competitor of Any Other New Telegraph Company.

The long and bitter telegraph war, the Western Union Telegraph Company ever engaged in, was ended yesterday. The Western Union never had so formidable a competitor as it has encountered and captured in the Baltimore and Ohio system. No other competitor could have held out so long, and the Baltimore and Ohio had out of a great sacrifice. In fact the deal was made on the terms that brought the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company to the verge of bankruptcy. On the one side it was a question of endurance, and on the Western Union side a matter of policy.

No one appreciates more keenly than Jay Gould what epoch-making telegraph means. He has been carrying his point with the American Telegraph Company, he captured Western Union. That he made up his mind that the only way to make the Western Union the monopoly that it was taking shape to become was to demonstrate that opposition concerns could not live in other words, to show that the Western Union could not survive at that time he made the offer that he would not buy any opposition except at his own price, which would be the cost of construction or less, unless he brought them to absolute ruin.

One by one the smaller concerns have succumbed in the hands of the Western Union, and now it has purchased the Baltimore and Ohio from the hands of a receiver, the R. and O. Telegraph property for just one-half what the Baltimore and Ohio people say it cost them. The only opposition left in the United States, an aggregation of smaller telegraph companies, which exist through the generosity of Mr. J. W. Mackay, the Western Union, by means of which it has been able to monopolize the market, will now be broken up, and it is understood, however, that while rates may be advanced slightly, there they have suffered most. It will be the policy of the concern to keep rates at such figures that no new competition will be possible.

The transaction between the Western Union Telegraph Company and the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company is an absolute purchase by the first named of all of the stock of the latter, and the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company is now a subsidiary of the Western Union.
